As he stood in line in front of me, the back of his T-shirt read, "Pain is weakness leaving the body." Though unsaid, it implied that the parting pain would be replaced by newfound strength. Yet, the more I thought about it, I wondered if that is always the case. Some pain simply leaves one empty, like the grief that comes with the death of one's child. That emptiness never leaves, it is never replaced. So too, the pain of living with mental illness, as it seems to isolate one from many of life's joys and satisfactions. Or, eventually, the aging process in all of us, as it slips in and steals the treasures of life, one by one. Pain is not always weakness leaving the body. Sometimes, it is the pain of an alien spirit settling in for the long haul.

If St. Paul's assertion that Jesus came and "emptied himself...coming in human likeness...even [to] death on a cross," then those times that seem to empty us of all we would hold dear are the times when we slowly take on the image of Jesus in our own lives. It is at such times when we are most powerless but also when God's spirit shines through our broken and wounded lives, if only because we become totally dependent upon God. It is Saint Teresa of Kolkata who is said to have once remarked that even God cannot fill what is already full.



- Jesus, death becomes life, and there's no need to escape: in eternal life, something extraordinary awaits us 7. "Jerusalem is right on our doorstep."
- 8. All people are born as originals but many die as photocopies".
- 9. To always be close to Jesus, that's my life plan". 10. "Sadness is looking at ourselves, happiness is looking towards God."
- 11. "Not me, but God.
- 12. "The more Eucharist we receive, the more we will become like Jesus, so that on this earth we will have a foretaste of heaven".
- 13. "The only thing we have to ask God for, in prayer, is the desire to be holy."

Holding her lifeless Son after He is taken down from the cross, and 7. Watching Jesus be buried in the tomb. Through these sorrows, Mary draws near to all who suffer. May we turn to her in our own times of grief and find peace and comfort in her loving, maternal heart.

There is no question that the Bible is pro-child. The first commandment of the Bible, "Be fruitful and multiply" (Gen 1:28) has not been cancelled. Another translation is "Be fertile and multiply." Psalms 127 and 128 further exemplify the pro-family attitude encouraged in the Bible. Children thrive best in a family of several children where they learn to give, share, and care. One of our favorite quotations on this subject comes from Pope John Paul II. He was making his first trip as Pope to the United States, and on October 7, 1979, he celebrated Mass on the Capitol Mall in Washington, D.C. In his homily he said: "Decisions about the number of children and the sacrifices to be made for them must not be taken only with a view to adding to comfort and preserving a peaceful existence. Reflecting upon this matter before God, with the graces drawn from the Sacrament, and guided by the teaching of the Church, parents will remind themselves that it is certainly less serious to deny their children certain comforts or material advantages than to deprive them of the presence of brothers and sisters, who could help them to grow in humanity and to realize the beauty of life at all its ages and in all its variety."
