

# **Good News!**

We live with a maze of instincts—some from the dark side and some from the light. In her book *Caste*, Isabel Wilkerson describes how cultures tend to consign certain individuals to the bottom of the social ladder. She specifically compares the caste system in India with how the Nazis sought to suppress and eliminate Jews and with the way blacks were oppressed by slavery and even in our own time. She describes the instinct in every society to relegate others to a lower class, always seeking to ensure that we are not at the bottom. This instinct can come from the dark side of people.

There is also an instinct for goodness to others, an instinct of light—to recognize everyone as brothers and sisters. As Saint John notes, "we are God's children now" (1 John 3:2). It is the voice of the Shepherd instilled in the human spirit that calls us into one fold, the voice of God urging us to healing goodness.

It is the dark side that nurtures white supremacy. It is the light that enables us to see beyond the color of our skin. It is the dark side that excludes those who seem different. It is the light that welcomes and offers hospitality. It is the dark side that succumbs to fear. It is the light of God's love that confronts the wolves of hate and urges us to follow. There is always tension between darkness and light.

Dear Friends, As I watched with the millions of others in the path of the solar eclipse, the fact that the Church also celebrated the Feast of the Annunciation was not lost in my meditation. The moon rarely blocks the sun out entirely, but every year the lunar cycle determines the date of Easter, and much else depends on that. So, the Feast of the Annunciation was transferred from its usual spot on March 25, which fell during Holy Week, to April 8, the first day after Holy Week and the Easter Octave. The coincidence of an eclipse with the Annunciation suggests that the meandering of the moon might be a matter for spiritual meditation. Mary is the woman with the moon at her feet and clothed with the sun. The moon is an appropriate Christian symbol for the Blessed Mother, as the moon has no light of its own, but only reflects the light of the sun; Mary reflects the light of her Son upon the face of the earth. But the moon is not purely ancillary much less merely decorative; its gravitational pull keeps The Annunciation gives a proper spiritual interpretation of a solar eclipse. For that singular moment in Nazareth, the moon determined whether the sunlight, the Son's light, would reach the world. Just as celestial movements offer those rare moments when the reach of the sun's light depends, fleetingly, on the moon, there was a singular moment in Nazareth. God sent his Son into the world, but dependent upon the free consent of the Virgin of Nazareth. Certainly, Mary was filled with grace and preserved from sin. Grace enhances freedom and sin erodes it; so, the sinless Mary, full of grace, was freer, not less. And the Incarnation depended upon her freedom, by God's own choice. The light coming into the world depended upon Mary to enter it. The sun depended, for that moment, upon the moon. Analogies are not exact. Mary never eclipses Jesus. In the beginning God said fiat lux (let there be light). And so it was. Mary replies was, fiat mihi (let it be done to me). And so He came to be among us. Mary, Queen of Heaven, Pray for us!

Did you know?
