## **Good News!**

Looking for proof of the resurrection is like looking for proof of love. Sometimes, we realize only gradually—bit by bit—that we are loved. John's Gospel abounds with images of light and darkness. So when this Sunday's Easter Gospel recounts Mary of Magdala going to the tomb early in the morning while it was still dark, the gospel is not simply marking the time of day. It's noting that what was taking place was before they believed in the resurrection, when they were still in the dark. All sorts of hints about the resurrection begin to occur: Mary sees the stone rolled away, Peter and the other disciple go to the tomb and find the burial cloths. They see the cloth that had covered his head rolled up and set aside. No apparition of Jesus, no men in white garments, no angels. Only hints that with the resurrection of Jesus, God has made all life new and destined for resurrection.

What, then, might one do who is plagued by doubts? Look for hints of resurrection, of life coming about where one expects only death (as if to symbolically enter the tomb). What types of hints? Going for counseling, as frightening as that may be, and finding peace. Talking through a problem in marriage. Finding that empty-nesting gives way to new life. Discovering retirement's gifts. Making a dreaded move to a new city or school. The resurrection of Jesus means God makes all life new. We only need to see it and discover that, bit by bit, it leads to faith.

The first report for the **2025 DPSC** has been sent to the parish. Our parish goal for Our Lady of Mercy is 21,945.00, St. John the Baptist is 41,331.00. To date Our Lady of Mercy is at 63 % of their goal. St. John the Baptist is at 68% of their goal. Once our parish goal is reached, 100% of the funds received beyond the goal are rebated to us for our parish needs. In addition to helping support our parish, the DPSC provides essential funding for our diocesan offices and ministries. **These funds are donor-restricted and can only be used to support parishes and ministries in the thirteen counties of our diocese, regardless of the outcome of the discernment process about the future of our diocese.**

At Our Lady of Mercy, so far, 23% of our 118 registered families have responded to the DPSC. At St. John the Baptist, so far 25% of our 217 registered families have responded to the DPSC. If you have not yet contributed, I ask you to please prayerfully consider making a donation of any amount.

**A recent Study** over a fifth of men aged 18 to 24 (21%) now say they are attending church monthly, higher than their female peers at 12%. Among those 18- to-24-year-olds, only 20% of churchgoers identify as Anglican, down from 30% in 2018, compared with 41% identifying as Catholic and 18% as Pentecostal. Among the populations studied, 18- to-24-year-olds were the most likely to say they believe there is “definitely a God/gods or higher power,” at 33%, and also the most likely to pray regularly, with 23% saying they pray at least daily compared with 17% of the rest of the population, and a total of 37% saying they pray at least monthly compared with 30% of the rest of the population. However, the report also found that the highest rates of Bible reading are within Baptist, independent evangelical, new churches, and Pentecostal expressions, all of which reported weekly Bible reading at around 90%. The lowest weekly Bible reading rates are among Anglicans and Catholics, at 61% and 56% respectively.

**Did you know,** Just over one-third (35%) of the total number of dioceses in the United States are considered “home mission dioceses.” (Of which the Diocese of Steubenville is one.) They are often in rural areas with small Catholic populations or are in communities that struggle economically and cannot provide basic pastoral services such as Mass, the sacraments, religious education, and ministry training for priests, deacons and lay people without outside help.
