

Invite Marty into your home and the first thing he'll ask is whether or not you have any cats. Marty is allergic to cats, big time, even if they have been quarantined to another room. His eyes turn red. He sneezes. He begins to cough and wheeze like an old-time Model T. Cats are his nemesis. It is ironic that Marty has befriended a stray cat from his neighborhood. Though he never pets the kitty or allows him into his home, each day he feeds him and puts milk out for him on the deck outside his living room. And if the cat fails to come around, he worries about him.

There is something instinctive in us that moves us to care for the underdog, even if it's a cat. The Sunday Gospel this week suggests that the innate desire to care for the weakest among us is a Godly instinct. It's where we meet God, and we need to pay attention to it simply because it's how we come to a sense of God in our lives.

We all search for meaning, looking for it every day in the hidden corners of our lives and in the open day-times of our busyness. Sometimes we find it, and sometimes we limp back home at the end of the day. More often than not it's when our day has been brushed with the color of caring for someone else that we feel good about that day. It's a Godly instinct that's not to be ignored.

49 Sessions were held during the Bingo Year with sessions canceled for Christmas and New Years and 1 canceled for Easter Sunday. Bingo contributed \$122,000 to St. John School during the year, consisting of \$102,000 in regular assessments plus \$20,000 in discretionary payments for teacher retention / signing bonuses / performance bonuses. Player attendance stagnated; attendance averaged 113 for the first half of the year versus 100 the second half of the year. Thank you to the countless volunteers for their support of the Bingo program and we ask for additional help on every group as worker help is directly tied to the amount of revenue received from ticket sales. The captains of each group deserve praise for their continued efforts as some people have been captains of their respective groups for over 2 decades.
