Advent is a time of hope but also a time of waiting. Different than wishing, hope is the belief that, one day, all will be well. Teenagers eagerly wait to be out on their own, believing then all will be well. Students are eager to graduate and get away from papers to write, books to read, and exams to take—then all will be well. Some singles long to find a partner, marry, and settle down, believing—then—all will be well. With the celebration of Thanksgiving this past week I offer the following reflection: Gratitude is the act of thankfulness that springs up from deep within us for getting or achieving something that we do not deserve. In St. Luke's Gospel, gratitude is demonstrated by the one Samaritan leper who realized that he had been cured by Jesus. This leper returned giving glory to God and thanking Jesus. In other words, gratitude springs from an understanding that we are stewards entrusted by God with gifts that we can never deserve. Perhaps our gift is our time. We are good at spending time with people and we give it away to others freely. May be a particular ability is our gift. We can teach others or help them to achieve some level of skill. Perhaps our gift is our treasure. We can share our treasure with our church and other charities to help eliminate some poverty, some hunger, some disease. Gratitude cannot be coerced or forced from someone. We cannot make someone be thankful. Parents might encourage their children to express their gratitude by writing a thank-you note or by sending a thank you email or text, or making a phone call. We express our thanks to God for all the blessings God has given to us. Interesting! Its a fascinating historical fact that in Europe, no Catholics were recorded as born or deceased between October 4 and October 15, 1582. This period marks the transition from the Julian to the Gregorian calendar, as decreed by Pope Gregory XIII, due to the inaccuracy in the yearly calendar affecting the date of Easter. Consequently, Thursday, October 4 was followed immediately by Friday, October 15, effectively-losing ten days. Over time, the Gregorian calendar gained global recognition and remains the standard calendar in use around the world today.
