

Good News!

There is so often a cost to being a follower of Jesus, to doing the right thing. During our country's Civil War, southern plantation owners came face to face with the gospel's imperative to accept slaves as human beings who have the right to be free, though that would then bring about the collapse of the cotton economy. For them, it was live the gospel or save the economy. Sometimes, the gospel seems to put us in a lose-lose situation.

President Lyndon B. Johnson was confronted by the Vietnam War. By continuing a war he knew was unwinnable, it would cost human lives. If he ended the war, he would be labeled as the president who lost a war. For him, it was lose-lose. Do the right thing or save face. A person may be confronted by a job that demands unjust and immoral decisions when the refusal to make such decisions would cost that person the job necessary to support his or her family. A student may be faced with the prospect of either cheating or receiving a poor grade. Living the gospel is fraught with costs.

Today, our nation faces the difficulties of immigration. On the one hand, there is the gospel's command to love the poor and so to accept immigrants seeking to escape violence and terror and drought, conditions that make it impossible to live. On the other hand, there is the need for our nation to deal with uncontrolled migration. The question of "What would Jesus do?" is never without consequences.



Welcome Back!

Taking a look back to a year ago, let's reflect on what has happened at St. John's.

New signage was built at the entrance to the school as well as a new sign on the building itself.

New lighting was upgraded for the front of the building and also by the cafeteria and the two classrooms.

New landscaping done by the road sign and in front of the entrance way to the building.

Storage boxes have been placed in front of the building and in the back of the building for the students to easily get balls, jump ropes, etc.

Mason Strahler has mowed the grounds, trimmed hedges and weeded since last fall. He has also done the snow removal for the school.

New cameras and more have need added to the building for the safety of the students.

A second set of doors added at the entrance to secure the safety of the students.

A pass-through window was made so papers or items could have a quick drop off without entering the building.

Pam Keeney's office was moved to the front of the building.

Teachers' workroom and Michelle's Office were moved so everyone would have better access to mailboxes and Michelle could have some privacy with parents, customers, etc.

Library was moved and a Conference Room was made by dividing one classroom.

Principal's Office was moved and all offices were repainted and air conditioning was put in each office.

New flooring was put in new conference room, all classrooms upstairs and all classrooms were painted as well as the hallway and entrance way to the building. An abatement was conducted to make sure no asbestos tile was broken and everything passed the test.

A music room was created and moved out of the cafeteria.

New curtains and blinds for the gym were installed as well as the stage floor being redone and the stage being painted.

New storage cabinets were placed in the hallway between gym and kindergarten classroom adding more storage for teachers and staff.

Cafeteria was repainted.

A sink was added to the new first grade classroom and the original sink for the science room was moved to the old 4th grade class-

Sleep green Inc. was added as our custodial service and the building is cleaned on a daily basis.

Gym was repainted as well as going down steps to cafeteria.

All "No Smoking Signs" were placed in the building as well as "No Concealed Weapons" allowed signage.

After almost 70 years the building has been rekeyed with digital locks and swipe keys only.

We are now managing our own Auxiliary Funds for at least the next two years.

Replaced all phones in building as we needed to upgrade before Nov. 2024.

None of the above would have been possible without our Foundation, Pioneer Pipe, Bosner Electric, AARK Communications, Eric Pottmeyer, Howard Brooker, Randy Schilling, Bernard Schilling, Crooked Tree Construction, Nathan Heiner, Nate Walters, Matt and Ashley Strahler, WCCC Welding Class, WCCC Auto Body Class, Graphic Design Class and Digital Marketing Class. Danny Jo Huck has made sure there is new mulch placed.

Last and certainly not least is Ken Huck, along with Alison Duvall, who keeps our internet, printers, chrome books and over all running of the building up-to-date so our teachers and staff can give our students the best education possible.

Without our <u>Home and School Association</u> many of the upgrades that were done would not have been possible without the generous contributions not only in monetary value but in giving of your time. Crystal Lang has kept our building always looking great with her decorations and any of the social activities for students and staff have been top notch.

St. John's will be spending the next 5 years going through accreditation and we will be needing all the help we can get to make sure that at the end of the 5-year cycle we are still an accredited school. Adding STEM classes this year will look good on our part as well as stepping up the student's education.
